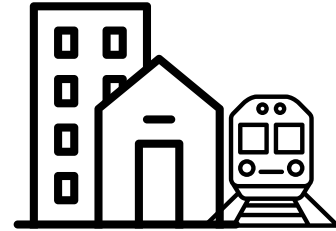

1. Expand Access to Affordable Housing

- Create more affordable places to live near public transit
- Expand workforce, student, low and very-low income housing
- Generate innovative new housing types that can be built for less



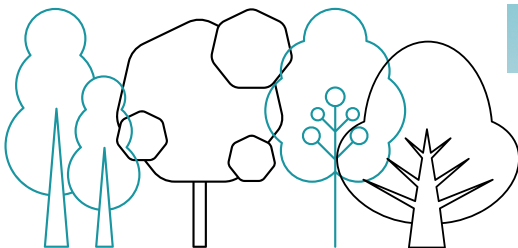
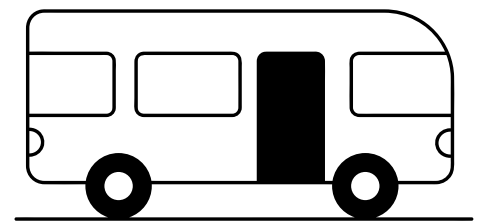
2. Revitalize Commercial Corridors

- Unlock the potential of vacant lots on commercial and transit corridors
- Bring new residents to revitalized commercial corridors



3. Improve & Expand Public Transportation

- Create new bus rapid transit corridors with faster travel times
- Renovate and improve Sac RT stations
- Support the acquisition of new light rail cars



4. Protect Our Natural Environment

- Maintain and expand our tree canopy
- Access additional funding for the American River Parkway

5. Repair Roads & Improve Active Transportation

- Create safer streets with more bike lanes and pedestrian crossings
- Repair worn-out roads
- Expand low-stress, safe, and convenient active transportation routes
