X STREET NAVIGATION CENTER

In partnership with SHRA and the City of Sacramento, this 100-bed shelter will provide a safe place for adults struggling with homelessness as well as case management and housing assistance, with the goal of moving our guests out of homelessness and into independent living.

OPERATED BY

Volunteers of America Northern California and Northern Nevada, a local, faith-based nonprofit organization. We are one of the largest providers of social services in the region, operating over 40 programs ranging from affordable housing to emergency shelter services for men, women, families, veterans, and seniors. In addition to housing, VOA focuses on intensive case management services to help transition individuals to permanent housing.

GUESTS

Up to **100 beds** available.

HOW LONG CAN GUESTS STAY?

VOA's goal is to move our guests into more permanent housing within 30-60 days, based on the individual's need.

HOW TO ACCESS THE SHELTER

The VOA outreach team and outreach referral partners including City of Sacramento's Department of Community Response, the Downtown Streets Team, and other local service providers will identify individuals living outside in the area adjacent to the X Street Navigation Center.

WHAT SERVICES ARE PROVIDED?

In addition to shelter, the center will offer life skills classes, recovery assistance, medical care, and financial assistance and housing retention case management services for up to 6 months.
